The Foundation finances its country programs through donor contributions from Strategic Partners and Friends of the Foundation. The returns on the Foundation's capital cover administrative costs in Switzerland in terms of volume. The corresponding financial figures can be viewed in the Foundation's revised annual accounts.

In addition, the Foundation works with local partners in a variety of ways to ensure that its purpose is sustainably anchored locally:

Alumni fund scholarships locally through their repayments as part of the Compromiso de Honor. These are counted as Foundation scholarships, regardless of whether they are awarded and administered by a local alumni organization.

There are also partnerships with local funding partners. On the one hand, foundation scholarships are co-financed by local donors (in particular through discounts from educational institutions). On the other hand, the foundation handles third-party scholarship programs or scholarships from local donors. Although in the latter case the selection and support of scholarship holders is also carried out according to the Foundation's proven criteria, the local donors are free to decide on the study programs financed, which is why the scholarships are not counted as Foundation scholarships.

Unless otherwise stated, the following key figures relate exclusively to the results achieved within the Foundation (i.e. excluding local donations/third-party programs).
